- Was this project challenging enough for you? Too challenging? What have you learned from it that you might be able to apply to future projects?

Give yourself a grade for technical merit on this assignment. In terms of print quality, levels of contrast, print alignment, proper exposure time, how does this body of work "rate"?
Give yourself a grade for the "content" of this work. In other words, how effective is it in capturing the feeling, atmosphere, and personal involvement of and with this place? How well does this body of work create a "sense of place" for the viewer?
