- Does your painting fall victim to "the wallpaper effect"? If not, what choices did you make to avoid this?
- What design elements play a prominent role in your painting (line, space, shape, form, value)?
- What was your level of engagement while working on this painting?
- What do you think the impact on the viewer is while looking at your painting (*what* observations or emotional responses do you imagine the viewer having)?
- What challenges did you encounter while working on this project?
- What did you enjoy most about working on this project?
- What would you do differently if you were to do this project again?
