Art Fundamentals – Course Syllabus Ms. Gross

Art fundamentals is an introductory course to the visual arts, as well as a prerequisite to several of the studio electives. This semester offers hands-on experience with making art, familiarity with art vocabulary and concepts, and a broader understanding of the visual arts role in contemporary society. Studio projects will explore two and three dimensional design, color theory, painting, and observational drawing using a variety of media. Historically significant techniques and influences will be presented and discussed with each project. Class expectations include:

- Successful completion of studio assignments.
- Completion of ongoing self-evaluations of studio assignments and personal progress.
- Participation in group critiques of student work.
- · Ongoing respect for self, others, and studio materials.

Course Topics:

- 1. Two-dimensional design
- 2. Observational drawing
- 3. Three-dimensional design/sculpture
- 4. Basic color theory and application (painting)
